WHAT IS BECEP?

Bismarck Early Childhood Education Program (BECEP), a part of Bismarck Public Schools, is made up of six programs serving children ages birth-5 and their families. Together, these programs serve more than 2,000 children!

Right Track: a free, in-home developmental screening program for all children ages birth to 3 living in Burleigh, Emmons, Grant, Kidder, McLean, Mercer, Morton, Oliver & Sheridan Counties

- Information and activities to promote child development
- Parenting ideas and support
- Referrals to other community agencies and events
- Serves over 1,400 children

Early Intervention: a free, in-home program for eligible children ages birth through 2 who are delayed or high risk for developmental delays living in Burleigh, Emmons, Grant, Kidder, McLean, Mercer, Morton, Oliver & Sheridan Counties

- Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) to meet child and family needs
- Services provided by: speech therapists, early childhood special educators, occupational and physical therapists, social workers, & a parent mentor
- Information and activities to promote child development
- Parenting ideas and family support
- Serves over 350 children and their families

Early Head Start: a free, in-home preschool program serving 10 infants and toddlers with and without disabilities and 2 expectant parents (priority given to teen parents) living in Burleigh, Emmons, & Kidder Counties. Eligibility is based on federal income or eligibility guidelines. Services are provided by a child development specialist.

- Family group activities offered
- Information and activities to promote child development
- Parenting ideas and support

<u>Head Start</u>: a free, preschool program for children ages 3-5 with and without disabilities living in Burleigh, Emmons, & Kidder Counties. Eligibility is based on federal income or eligibility guidelines. Classes are taught by a Head Start teacher & paraprofessional staff.

- Full days; 5 days a week
- School readiness and social-emotional skills taught
- Information and activities to promote child development
- Parenting support provided
- Serves 119 children



Early Childhood Special

Education: a free, preschool program for children ages 3-5 who meet eligibility criteria based on the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and live within the Bismarck Public School District. Classes taught by an Early Childhood Special Education teacher & paraprofessional staff.

- Individualized Education Plan (IEP) to meet child needs
- Services provided in a preschool classroom, in the community, at home, or through outpatient, determined by child's IEP Team
- Possible services include: special education resource services, speech therapy, physical and occupational therapy, & vision and hearing services
- Morning or afternoon classroom option
- School readiness and social-emotional skills taught
- Serves over 200 children

Community Friends: a tuition based, preschool program for children ages 4-5 who demonstrate age-appropriate skills including good language and social-emotional skills and a developmentally appropriate activity level. Community friends are enrolled in Early Childhood Special Education classrooms and taught by an Early Childhood Special Education teacher.
